## Children's Day

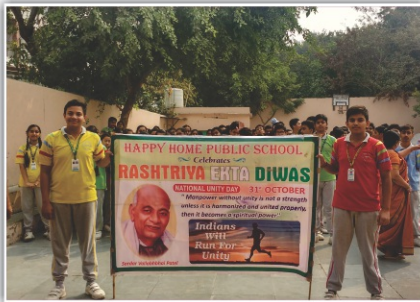

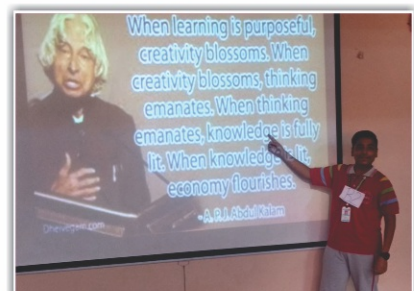
## Run for Unity

## Vigilance Awareness Week

The widespread corruption has an adverse effect on the development of a nation. In order to create awareness about the corruption, HHPS observed 'Vigilance Awareness Week' from 29<sup>TH</sup> October, 2018 to 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2018. Students showed great enthusiasm in different activities like pledge taking event, slogan writing, poster making, cartoon making, poem recitation, interactive sessions, rally and candle march against corruption were conducted in the school. ## Earthquake Evacuation Mock Drill



To educate and train the students for an unforeseen emergency situation like earthquake, school conducted a mock exercise and evacuation drill by the disaster management team. An evacuation plan was established defining all the exit points in the most panic situations. It was conducted to sensitize the staff and the students about life saving and rescue techniques. Provisions for alternative routes were also the part of evacuation plan. Students from the whole school assembled in the school playground where the respective class in charges confirmed their whereabouts by marking their attendance. Students were also tutored to maintain calm and courage in such dreaded circumstances.

## Pocso Workshop

The workshop on POCSCO held in HHPS dealt with the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights. The workshop was conducted by founder chairman of Buddhi World Mr. Manish Gupta. It emphasized that child abuse is rampant in schools, homes, neighbourhoods and public places and India is the largest consumer and supplier of pornography. Keeping this in mind, the POCSCO Act, 2012 was started which addresses all sexual offences below the age of 18; discussions on the important features of this Act like complete privacy and gender neutrality were also catered. There is a mandatory role of teachers in reporting any incident of child abuse also. Teachers must recognize the symptoms of sexual abuse and know how to deal with it. It is the responsibility of the school and Management to be vigilant at all times. The workshop also put light on the processes under the POCSCO Act like processes at the police station, processes at the Child Welfare Committee, processes for the medical examination of the child and processes at the Special Court.

The workshop was very informative and gave clarity to the audience on a number of points.

## Fire Safety Drill

Schools have a critical infrastructure entrusted with the responsibility of creating citizens of tomorrow. A safe and secure environment is a prerequisite for effective teaching and learning. Thus ensuring safety of children, teachers and staff members during disasters is necessary. Fire safety awareness and prevention remains a key issue for students and educators alike, and Happy Home Public School strives to make its teachers aware and up-to-date. Keeping this in mind, a workshop on -How to operate Fire-fighting equipment was organized for the teachers. The speaker on the occasion was a Fire Safety Counselor Mr. Parvesh Kumar (Sub Officer). He shared simple and easy to follow safety tips, explained the functioning of a fire extinguisher and spoke of the DOs and Don'ts regarding possibilities of fire. The session proved to be informative and an imperative lesson on life-saving skills.





# WORKSHOPS

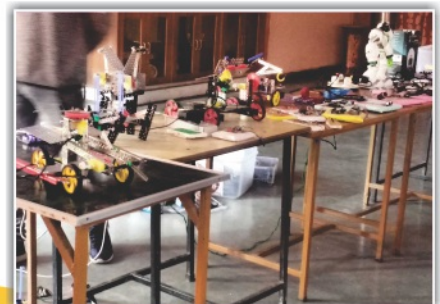
## Health & Hygiene - Whisper

Importance of education in the preservation, transmission and improvement of knowledge that brings immense benefit to the students ensures proper awareness. There is no doubt that educating women brings greater benefits to society as family health, child survival, human capital investment, productivity and even average life expectancy experiences significant improvement. Appropriate selection, use and disposal of sanitary materials as well as adequate body cleaning with soap, and seeking suitable diet during menstruation ensure good menstrual hygiene. There is no doubt that a girl child who remained in school would be more knowledgeable about menstrual hygiene which would also safeguard her health, with this thought in mind workshop was conducted at HHPS. Girls become more aware and clear about their health.



## Robotics

Happy Home Public School has organized a workshop on Robotics on 3rd Dec 2018 in the multipurpose hall. The team guided and demonstrated the different kinds of robots to the students. Around 80 students from different classes had participated in the workshop. Workshop begins with introduction of robotics and how robots are used in our day to day life. The workshop was aimed at creating a practical approach towards electronics, mechanical and robotic mechanism and creating some robots which had basic functionalities such as sensing sound, light, obstacles, etc. and reacting to them in different ways. ## OH! Max Wonderland

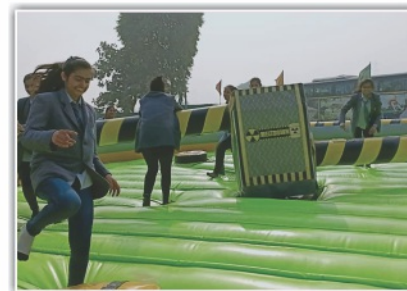

## Happy Trails

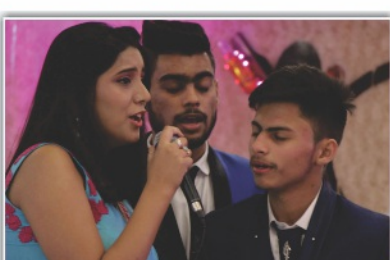
