INDEPENDENCE DAY

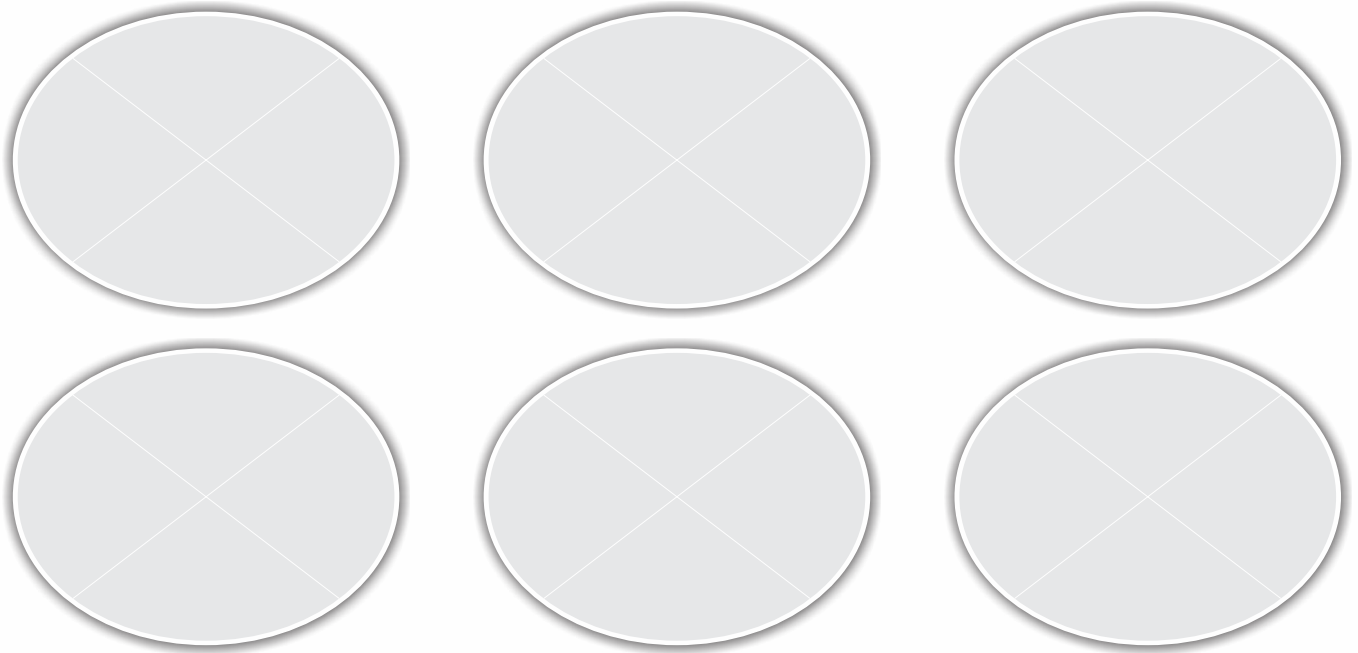

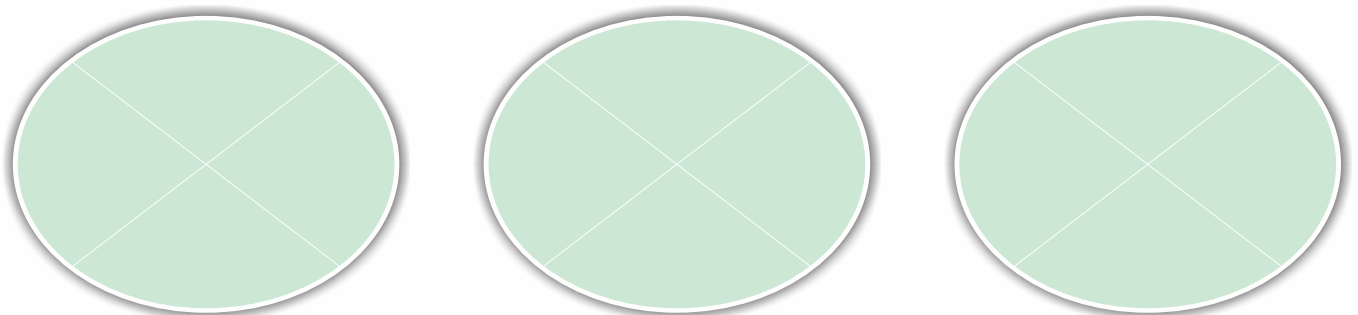
RAKSHA BANDHAN

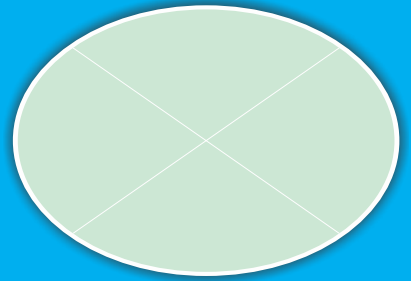
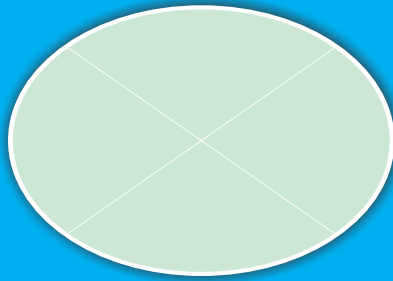
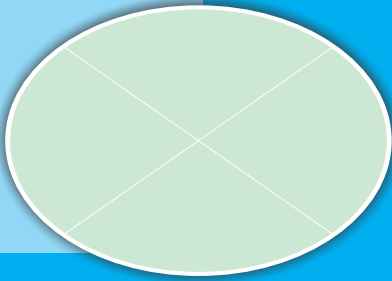
CLEAN YAMUNA DRIVE

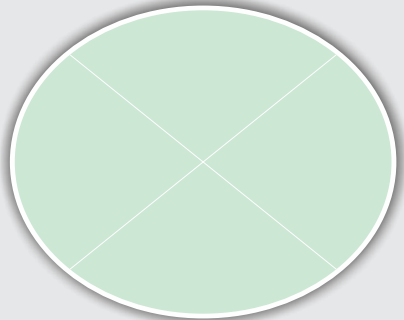
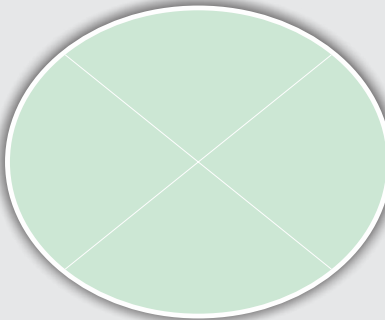
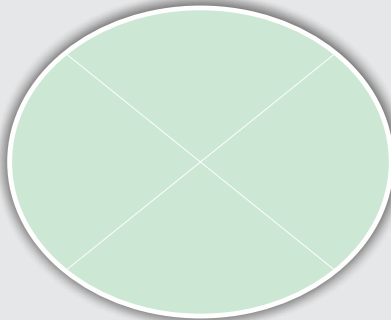
INDIA FITNESS WEEK

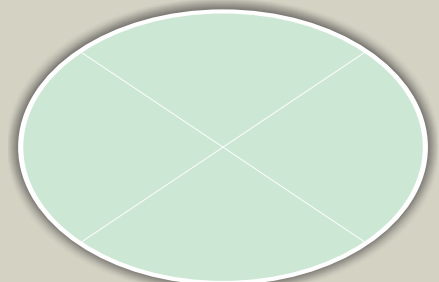
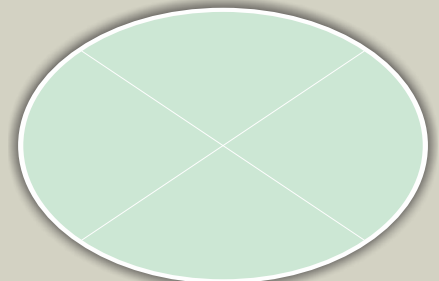
WORKSHOP BY MANAV RACHNA

INTER HOUSE COMPETITIONS

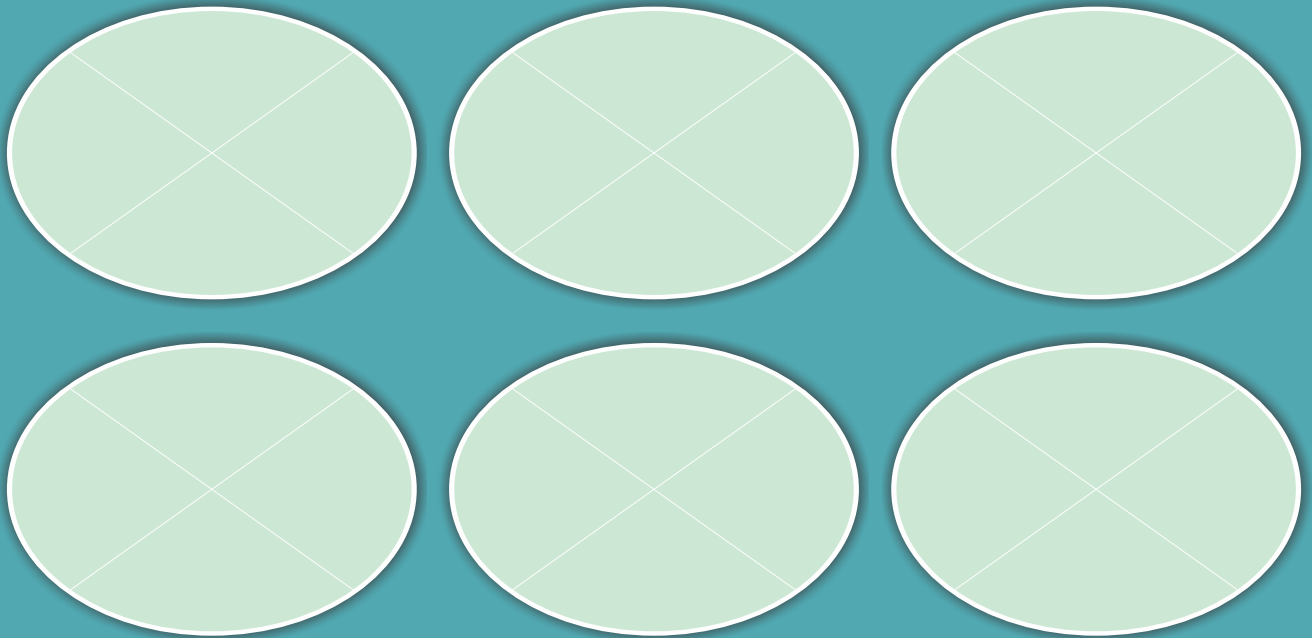

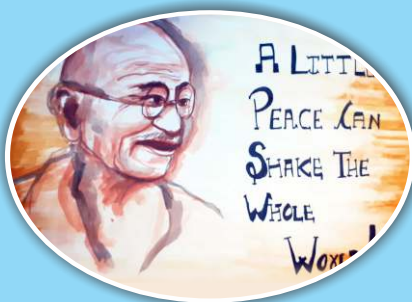
SWACHTA PAKHWADA

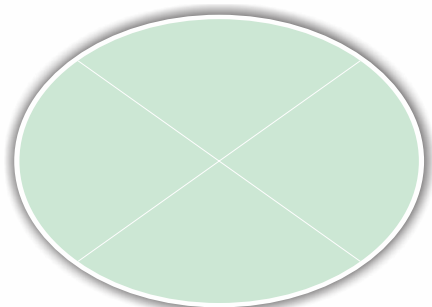
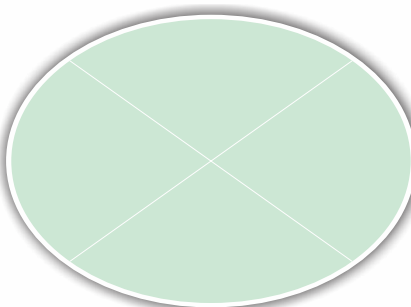
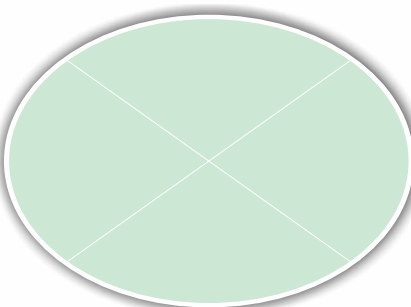
TEACHER'S DAY

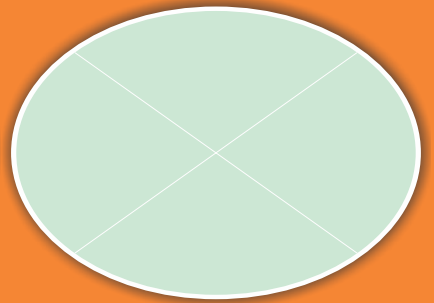
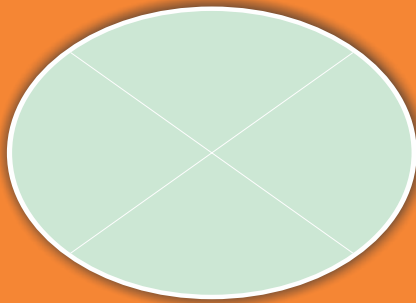
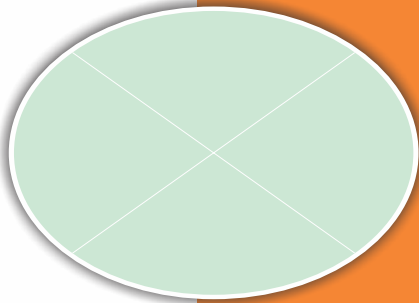
HINDI EXTEMPORE

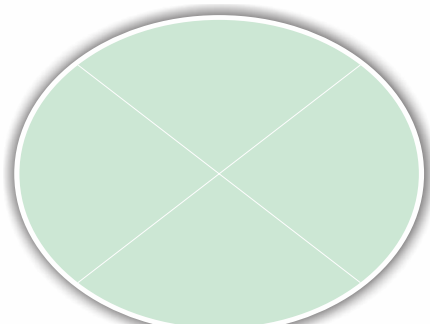
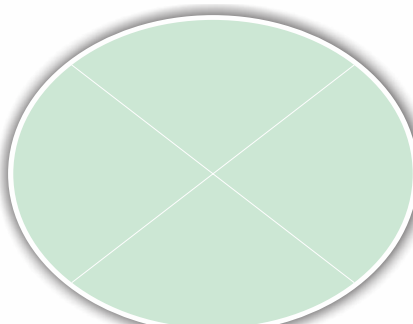
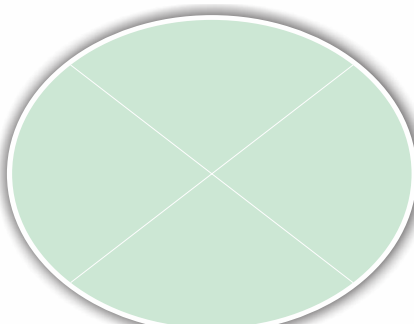
AWARD BY SINGH STUDY CIRCLE
