I would like to reiterate the thoughts of our hon'ble former President Late Dr. APJ Kalam from his poem 'Song of Youth'-

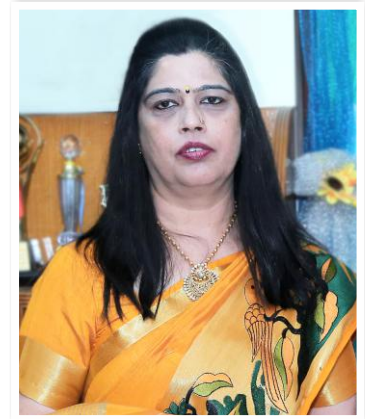
"I will work and sweat for a great vision,

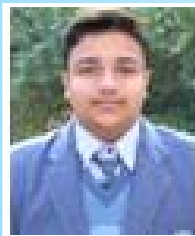

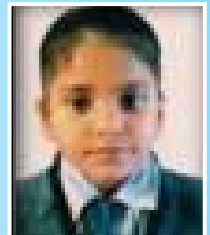

### A Glimpse :

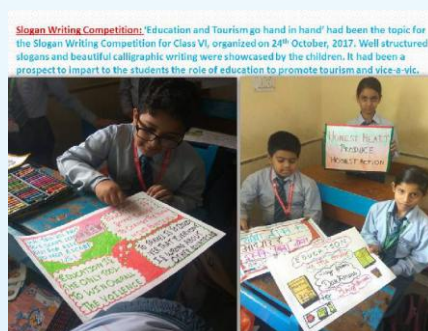

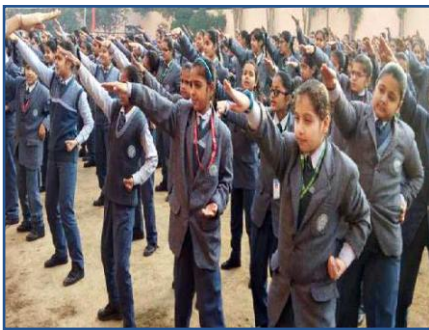


## GUIDANCE AT THE RIGHT AGE-CAREER WORKSHOP

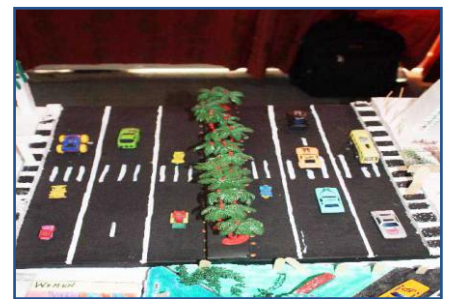

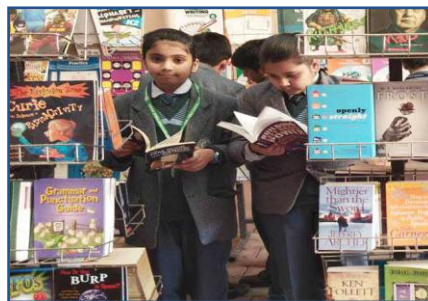
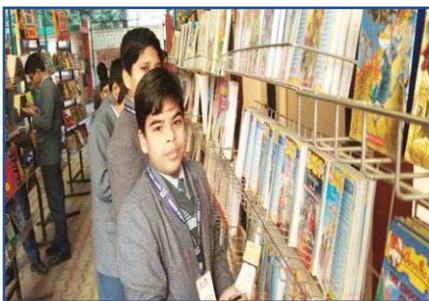
## FIRE EVACUATION MOCK DRILL
